Purpose is to distinguish:

- 1. Custodial vs. noncustodial accounts
- 2. Off-chain vs. on-chain activity
- 3. "Accounts" vs. "wallets"
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  - Your bank account is an example of a custodial account (the bank has custody of your money and executes transactions on your behalf).
  - You must undergo KYC (Know Your Customer) processes to get a bank account.
  - Bank accounts can be frozen (preventing you from accessing your money).
- Money kept in a noncustodial account is under direct control of the person who owns the money.
  - Your pocket is an example of a noncustodial account (you retain direct control and access to your money)
  - You do not undergo any KYC to keep your money in your pocket.
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  - Your Coinbase account is an example of a custodial account (Coinbase has custody of your crypto and executes transactions on your behalf).
  - You must undergo KYC (Know Your Customer) processes to get a Coinbase account.
  - Coinbase accounts can be frozen (preventing you from accessing your crypto).
- Crypto kept in a noncustodial account is under direct control of the person who owns the crypto.
  - You can create a noncustodial crypto account using a noncustodial wallet client (i.e. software) such as MetaMask (you retain direct control and access to your crypto)
